THESE are the shoppers of the future and new research shows this Alpha Generation will shop "vastly differently to the way we shop today".

McCrindle Research and projections by Professor Jan Recker of Queensland University of Technology highlights that today's preschool and kindergarten kids will in 2034 return to basics and buy more fresh, local produce.

"They will no longer travel to a shop for pantry or dry goods but will centre their shopping on fresh and local produce," the Evolution of Fresh report, commissioned by Woolworths, says.

And early learning educators are on the same page with these projections as they focus

on teaching the youngsters where food is sourced, how to identify unusual produce and ingredients and how to handle money.

"Shopping is part of our children's play-based learning. Earlier in the year, we created a little shop in the foyer where our preschoolers sold goods donated from home to other parents with all the proceeds donated to charity," Goodstart Early Learning Indooroopilly centre director Rebecca Seymour said.

"We are talking about money and what it is used for currently in our preschool room."

"And we are teaching children that goods have value. Children grow their own vegetables and then pre-

DESPITE busy schedules and the frustrations caused by those kids who refuse to eat more than Vegemite sandwiches, more and more families are ditching the takeaway to eat a home-cooked meal together.

A Newspoll conducted for *The Sunday Mail* found 43 per cent of people with children eat at home more often now than they did 12 months ago.

One third of respondents eat a home-cooked meal seven days a week and 44 per cent do so five to six times a week.

qui Riddell, 26, (pictured) said it was important her family enjoyed an evening meal together and she hoped that as her children got older it would become an easier habit to instil every night. She said she, hus-

band Shane, 28, kids Chloe, 3, and Alexys, 18 months, rarely ordered takeaway, preferring to dine at home.

"We eat in six to seven times a week. On occasion we'll buy out but in my opinion buying out is very expensive compared to what I can cook for the same amount of money and sometimes the quality is just not there either," she said.
