BRIEF BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Jan Recker is [Alexander-von-Humboldt Fellow](#), [Nucleus Professor for Information Systems and Digital Innovation](#) at the [University of Hamburg](#), and Adjunct Professor at the [QUT Business School](#). He previously held positions such as inaugural Woolworths Chair of Retail Innovation and Leader of the Digital Innovation Research Group at [Queensland University of Technology](#), Chaired Professor for Information Systems and Systems Development at the [University of Cologne](#), Visiting Chair Professor at [Hong Kong Polytechnic University](#), Visiting Professor at the [Wuhan School of Software](#), and Adjunct Professor at the [University of Agder](#).

Jan Recker holds Bachelor and Master of Science degrees in Information Systems from the University of Münster and a PhD in Information Systems from Queensland University of Technology. His theses received multiple national and international [awards](#). When he was promoted to Full Professor in 2012, he was one of Australia's youngest professors in its history.

Jan is an [award-winning](#) scientist. Jan is one of the University of Hamburg's ten [most cited scholars](#) and remains one of QUT's 25 [most read authors](#). He ranks as one of the [most published information systems academics of all time](#). In current research rankings, he is [the most successful European IS scholar based on publications in the field's top journals](#) over the past five years. He is listed in [Stanford's list of top 2% of scientists on the planet](#), at 2nd position in Information Systems in Germany and 92nd globally (out of 18561 listed Information Systems researchers). According to [research.com](#), he is one of only two German scholars featuring in the top 100 lists for both Business & Management and Computer Science. In 2019, he was named [#1 Business Researcher](#) under 40 years of age by the German publication *Wirtschaftswoche*. In 2018, he was named an [AIS Fellow](#), the youngest ever IS academic to receive this award.

Jan's research explores how firms deal with the opportunities and challenges of **digitalization and artificial intelligence**. Jan is an *engaged field researcher* and works with particularly large organizations (such as Olympus, Apple, Bertelsmann, Volkswagen, Woolworths, SAP, Edeka, Hilti, Commonwealth Bank, Federal Police, Lufthansa, Ubisoft, and others) as well as with emerging small- and medium-sized companies (such as Clipchamp, Cognigy.AI, Guidecom, Vytal, and others). Jan is *methodologically versatile* and uses quantitative, qualitative, and computational methods in his work.

His research has appeared in leading information systems, entrepreneurship, organization science, management science, computer science, and social science journals. He has also written popular textbooks on [scientific research](#) and [data analysis](#), which are in use in over 500 institutions in over 60 countries. He is co-host and producer of the podcast "[this IS](#)

[research](#)", which has become a [leading educational resource](#) and most successful podcast for emerging business and technology researchers.

Jan is a globally-respected authority in the field. He is presently Senior Editor for the [MIS Quarterly](#), the leading journal of the field, the [Journal of the Association for Information Systems](#), the flagship journal of the field, and the [European Journal of Information Systems](#), the most important European journal in the field. Between 2015 and 2020, Jan was Editor-in-Chief of the [Communications of the Association for Information Systems](#), one of two flagship journals of the global information systems association. He co-edited a number of special issues on [digital innovation](#), the [management of artificial intelligence](#), and [strategic entrepreneurial action](#), and presently co-edits a MIS Quarterly special issue on [Registered Reports](#) and a Journal of the Association for information Systems special issue on [Digital Responsibility](#).
